16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The institute follows the guidelines set by the UGC and our affiliating university, and in preparation for the implementation of NEP-2020, it has encouraged students to register for an ABC ID on the portal www.abc.gov.in. Previously, the credit system did not support transfer between institutions, nor did it allow for multiple entries and exits for students. However, under NEP-2020, students now have the flexibility to enter and exit multiple times, with their credits deposited in the ABC transfer as needed.

College's students have already opened their accounts on the ABC port. Additionally, students can earn up to 50% of extra credits from other sources such as SWAYAM, NPTEL, etc., with the validity of these credits governed by norms and guidelines.

The ABC serves as an authentic platform for checking the credit record of a student at any given time. This not only encourages a multidisciplinary approach among students but also aims to equip them with skills and professionalism. NEP-2020 further expands the learner's horizons, offering a wide range of opportunities globally.

The institute is diligently working to meet all criteria for NEP-2020 implementation and encourages students to open accounts for a progressive enriching educational journey.

17.Skill development:

To enhance students' skill set alongside their core education, the college has a well-established Skill Development Cell and a language laboratory. Various programs under these initiatives are already underway. Additionally, through industry-institute MoUs and collaborations, the college is making concerted efforts to equip students with relevant skills. Certificate programs by Career-Katta, Infosys, and TCS are being conducted in the institute to enhance students' skill proficiency.

In conjunction with these initiatives, the institute also organizes skill development programs such as communication skills and interview skill programs. Furthermore, to foster a multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approach, the institute offers courses like LED light repair and maintenance and mechanical fitting.

Initiatives such as the Modilipi workshop for students have been conducted, and a bilingual teaching method is employed as the medium of instruction in our college. Furthermore, students have completed online courses offered by platforms like SWAYAM, NPTEL, and others.

The college also observes various commemorative days to raise awareness about Indian culture and heritage among students. Additionally, to educate the community about Indian medicinal plants and their properties, a workshop was conducted, and medicinal plants were distributed. Film screenings in various languages are organized to foster cultural harmony among students.

Moreover, the college arranges art workshops, museum visits, excursions, field trips to impart knowledge about Indian traditions and values to students.
