A ten days research methodology Course was organized on the theme "Research Methodology" by Department of Economics and IQAC, Arts Science and Commerce College Rahata, during 5th to 15th October, 2022 in collaboration with, "The Indian Council of Social Science Research", (ICSSR), Western Regional Center (ICSSR), Mumbai. The primary aim of organizing such a course was to equip research scholars (belonging to social sciences) to achieve the research degree. The research methodology course for research scholars in social science is expected to cover the basics of research methodology focusing on theoretical and practical inputs. Specifically, the formulation of research problem, formulation of research hypothesis, testing of hypothesis, conducting literature review, data collection methods, selection of appropriate parametric or non-parametric statistical method for analysing data, and report writing.

Research Methodology is a technique used to select, identify and analyse information about a topic. In a research paper, the methodology section allows the reader to evaluate the study's reliability. The available data may be grouped into four main types based on methods for collection i.e.

A) Observation B) Experimental C) Simulation D) Derived methods

Research Methodology is as follows

1. Quantitative Research 2. Qualitative 3. Descriptive 4. Applied

Research Methodology is useful for a researcher to design a study for ensuring valid and reliable results that address the aim and objectives of Research. Good Research Methodology helps to achieve the goal effectively. The Methodology justifies the design choices by showing that the chosen methods and techniques are the best fit for research aims. A good Research Methodology provides scientifically sound findings. Developing Research Methodology is an integrated part of research design. It provides a detailed plan that helps to keep Researchers on proper track, making the process smooth, effective and manageable in tune with the primary aim.

- ❖ To impart skills for formulation and testing of hypothesis based on the nature of research.

- ❖ To make aware the participants about latest trends in social science research discipline.

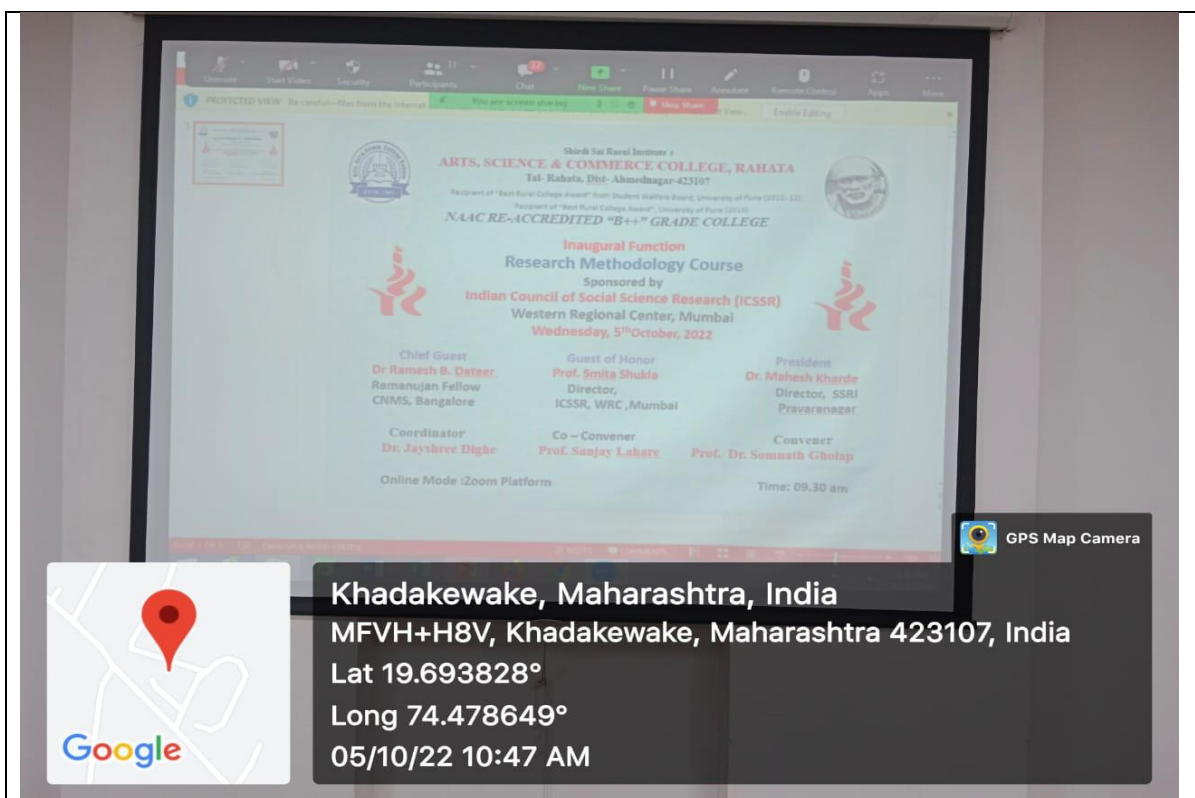

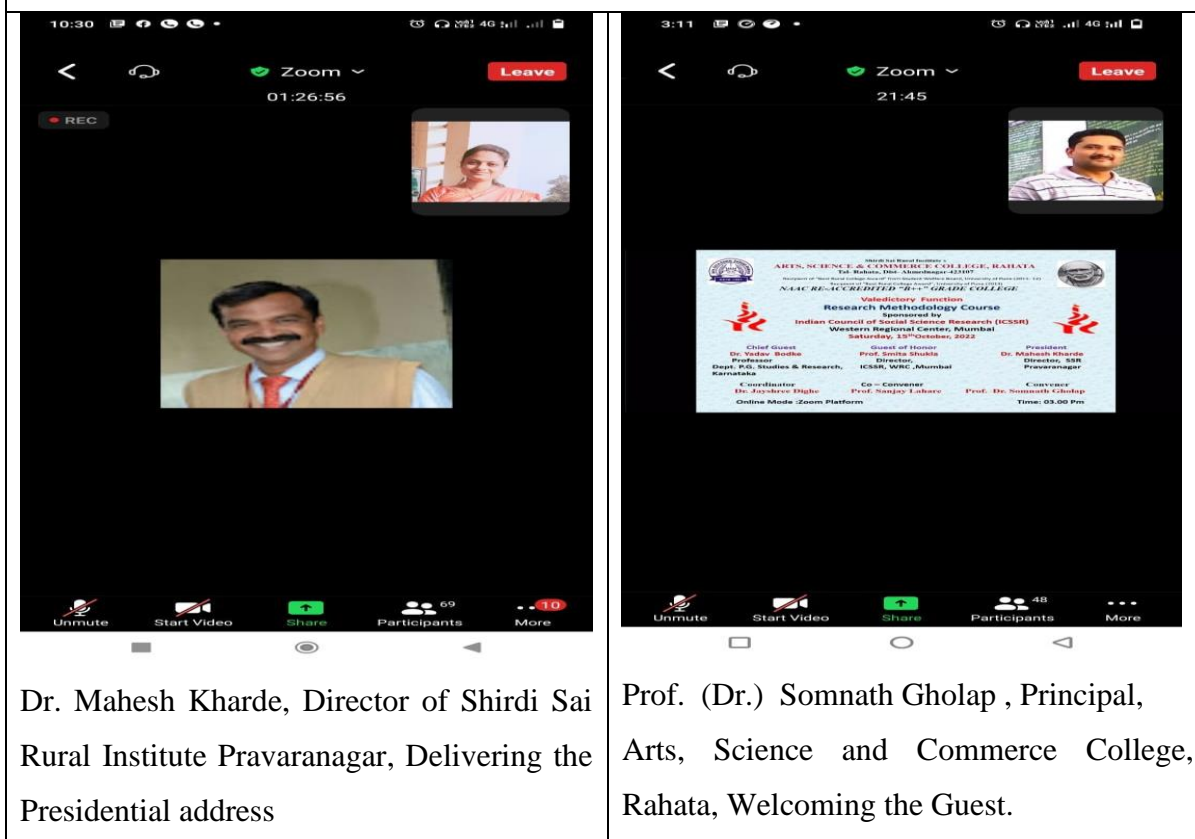
1st session

Inaugural session

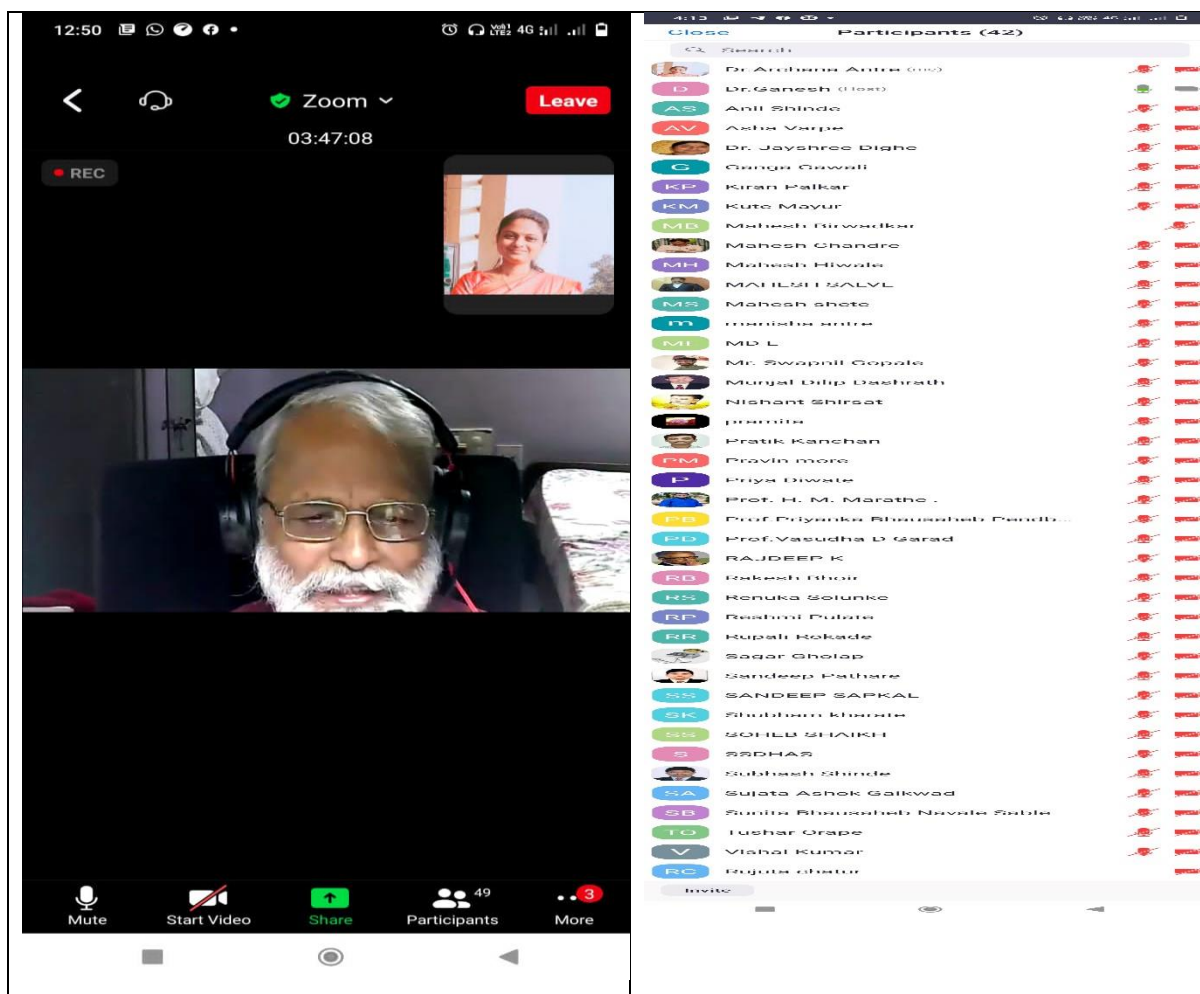

Day 1st : 4th session

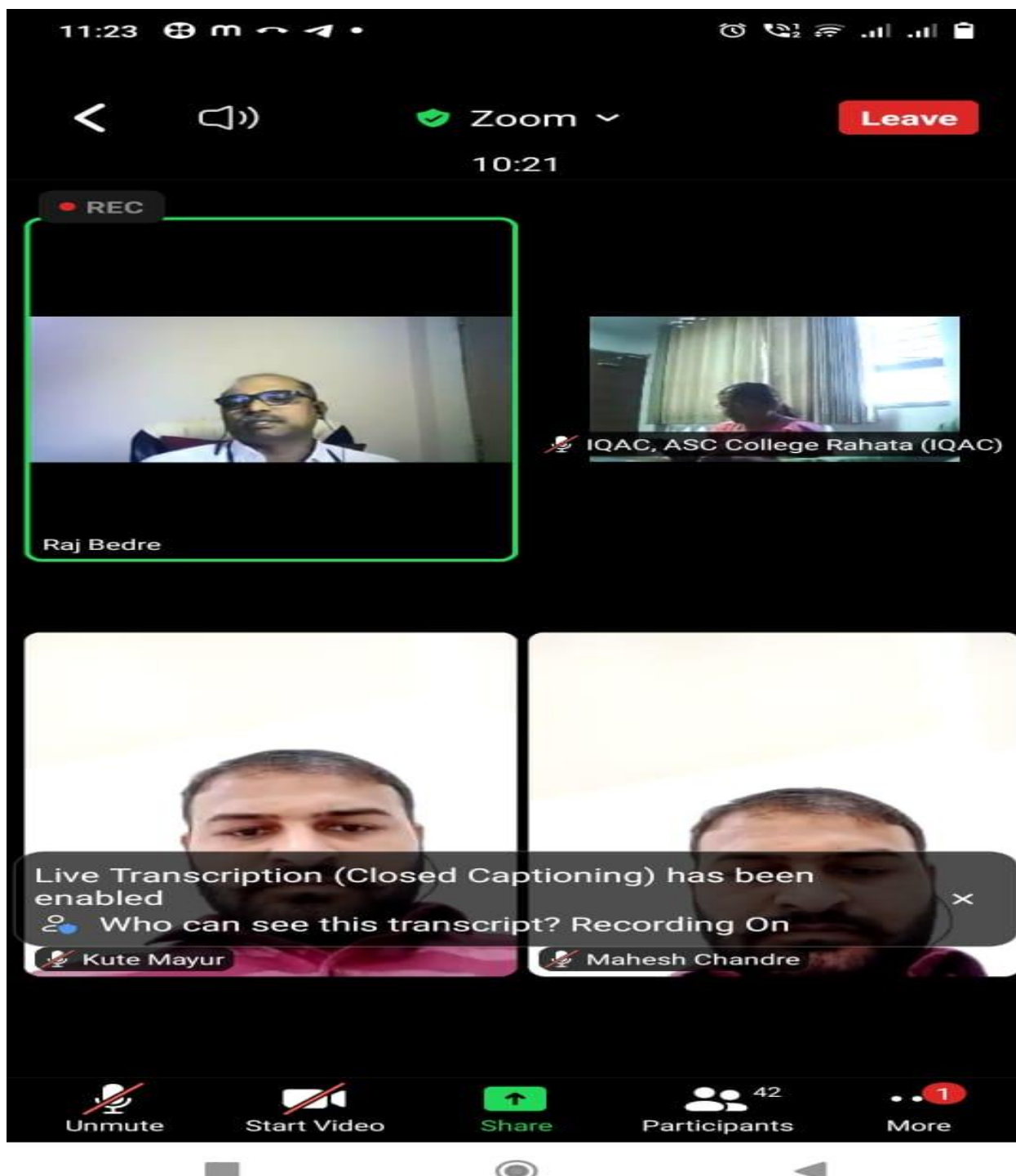
Topic: Unit of analysis

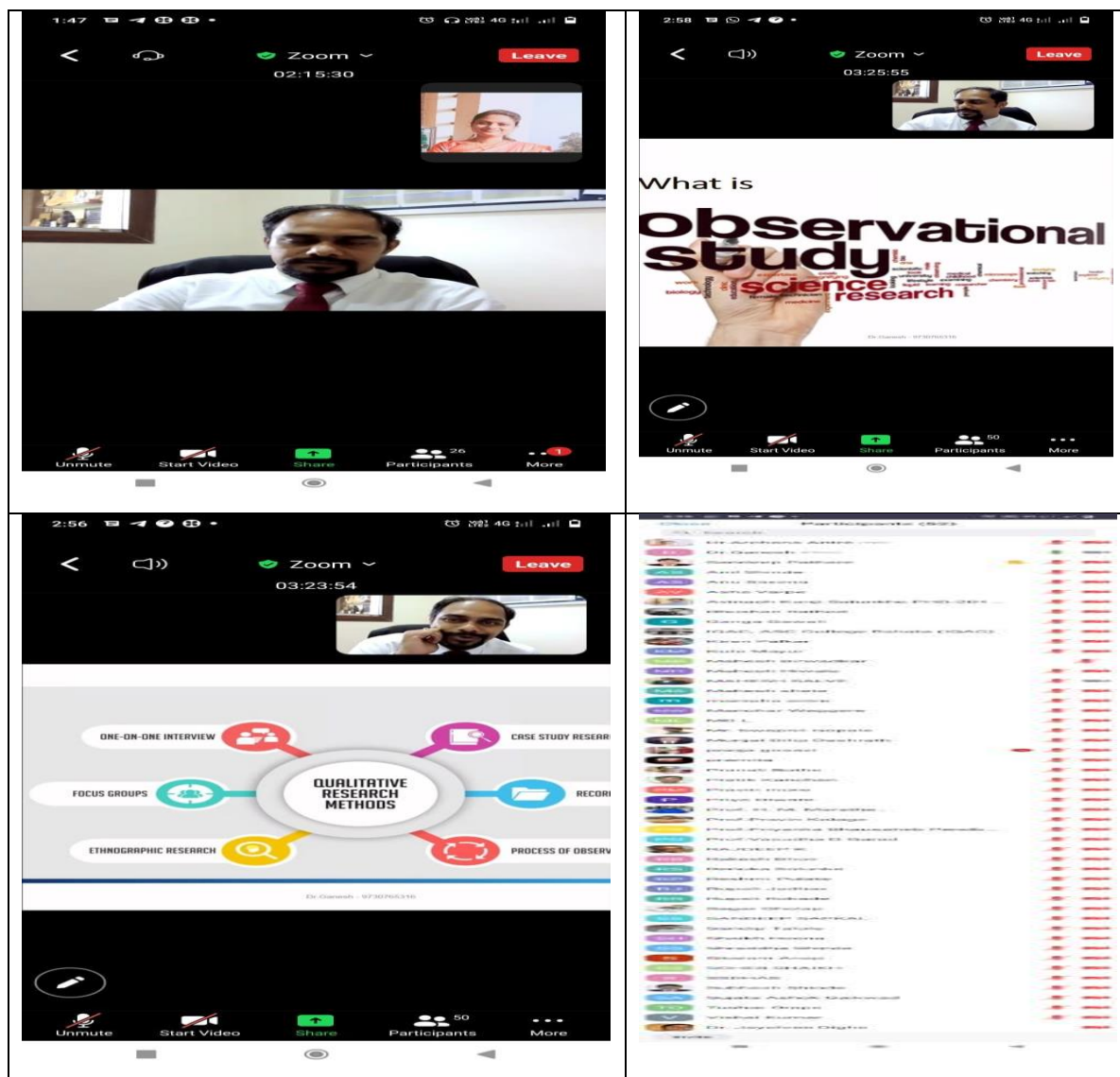

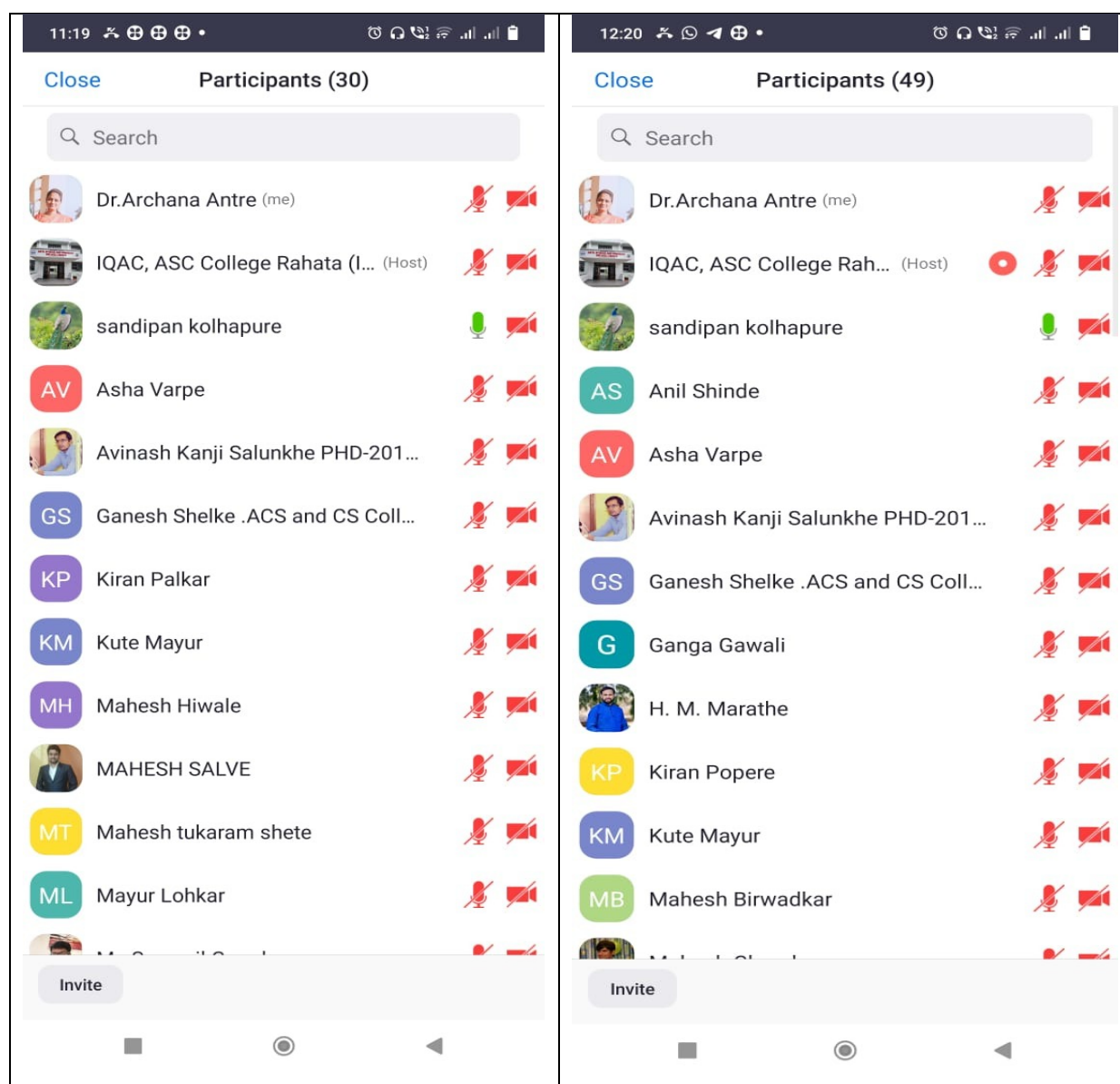
Topic: Observation and Case Study

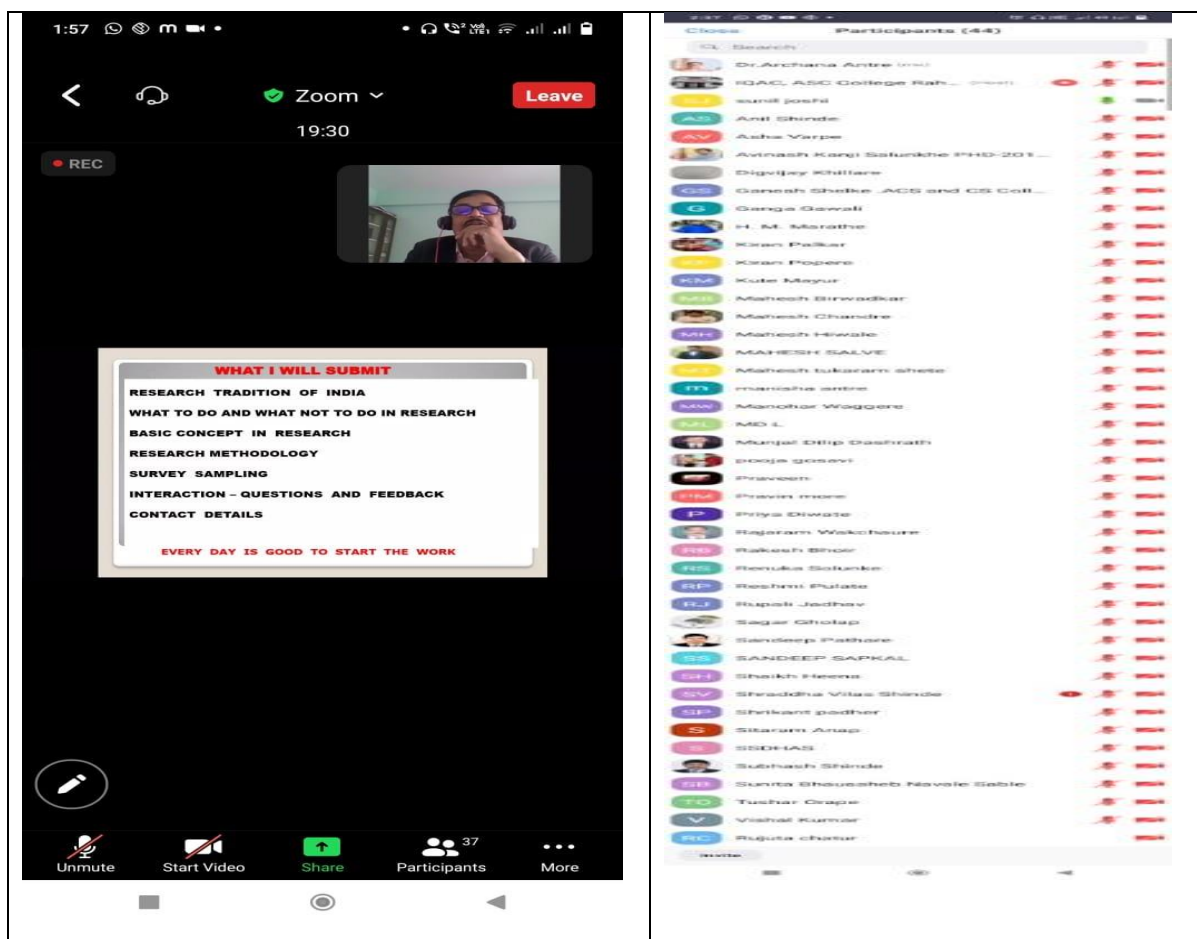
schedule - Select your subjects/ key informants- Conduct the interview- Analyze and interpret data *collected* from the interview.

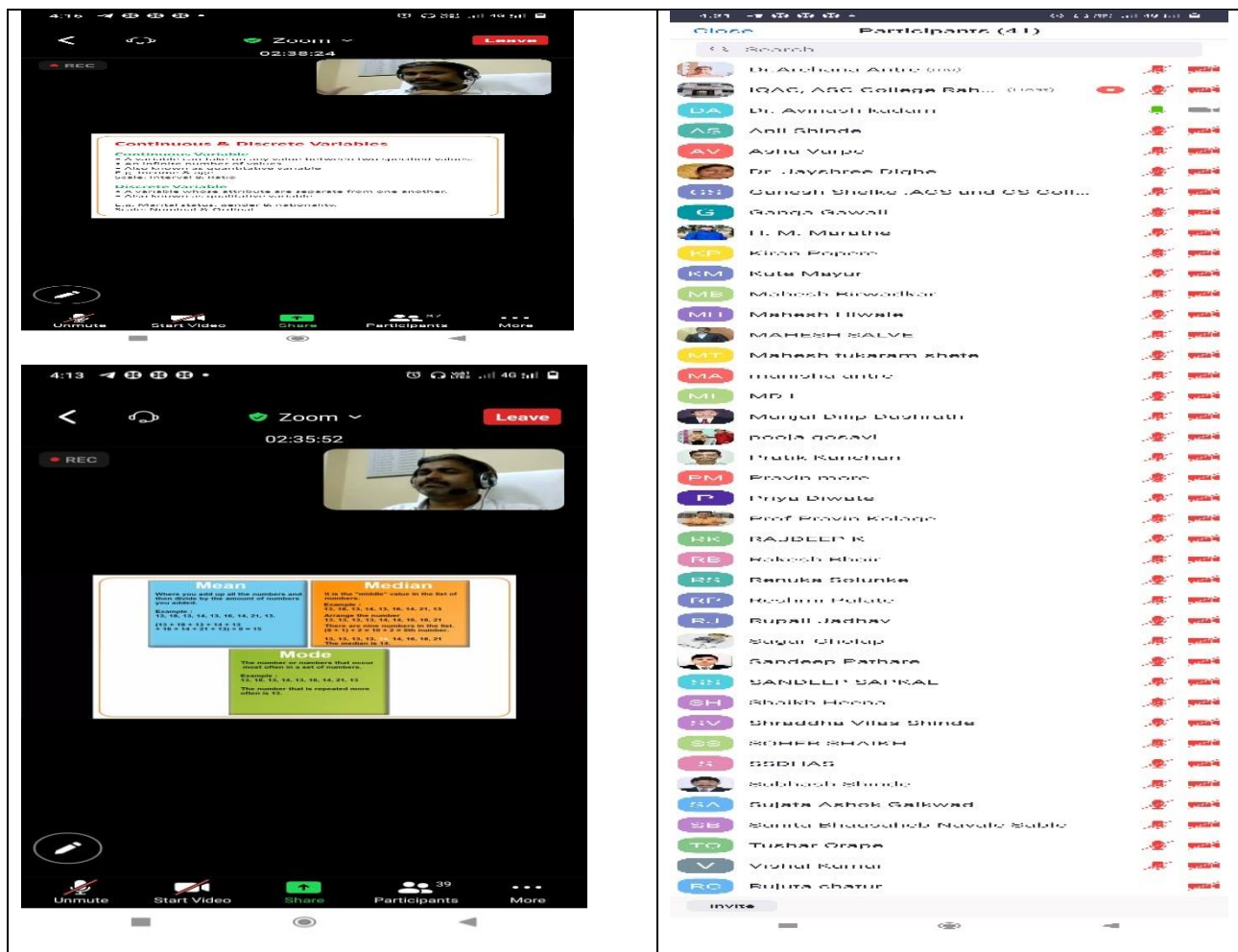

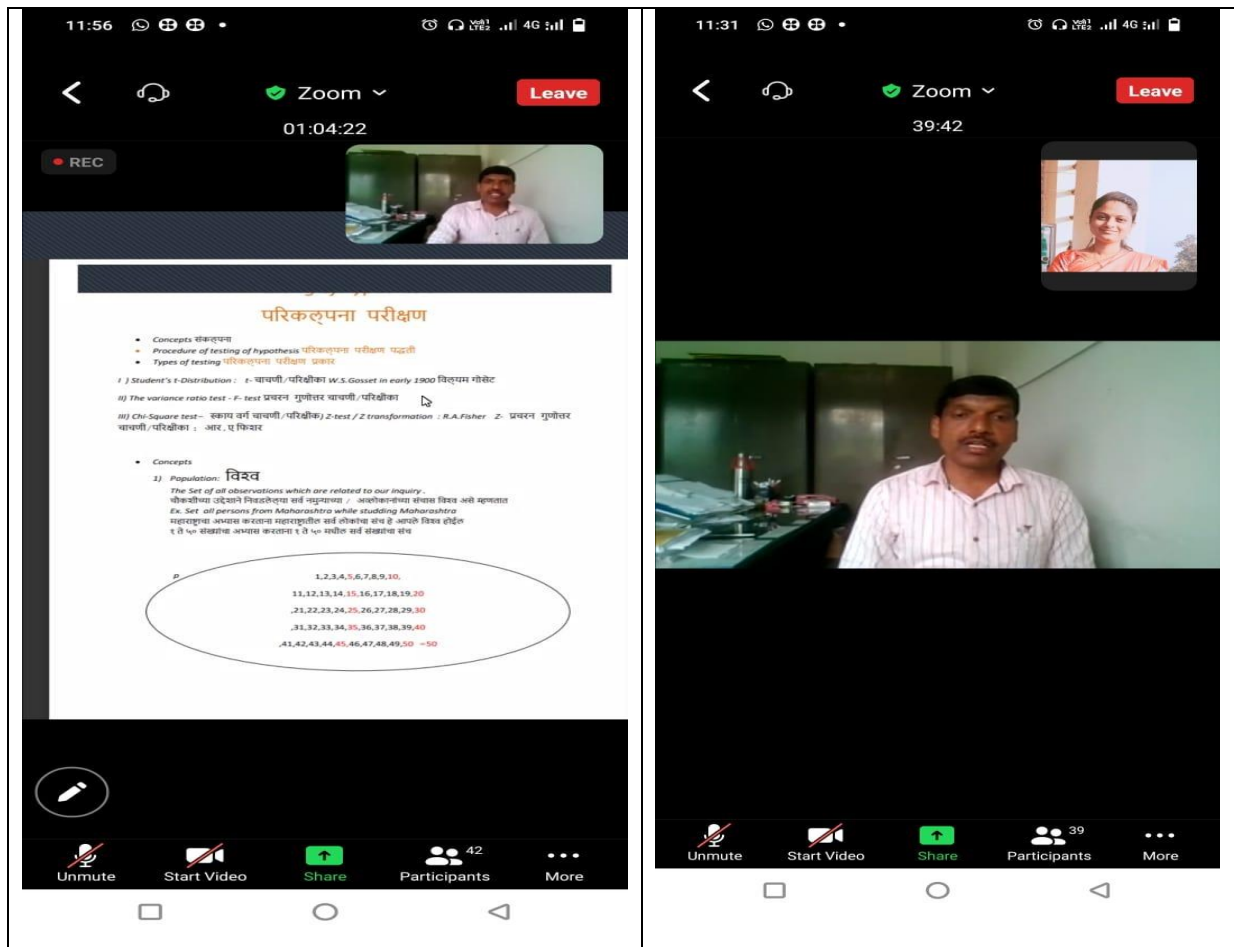


Snapshot of 3rd Session of 3rd day.

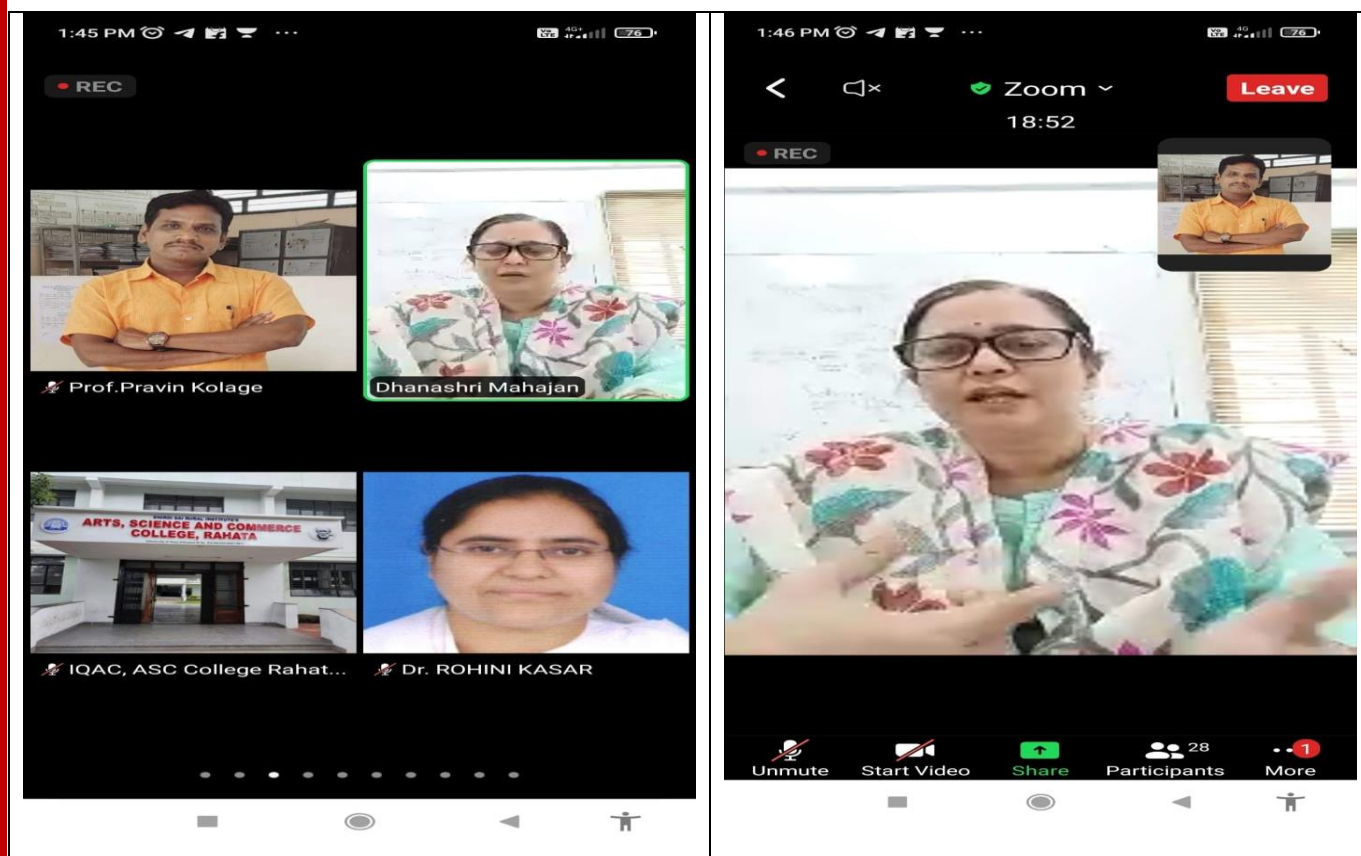

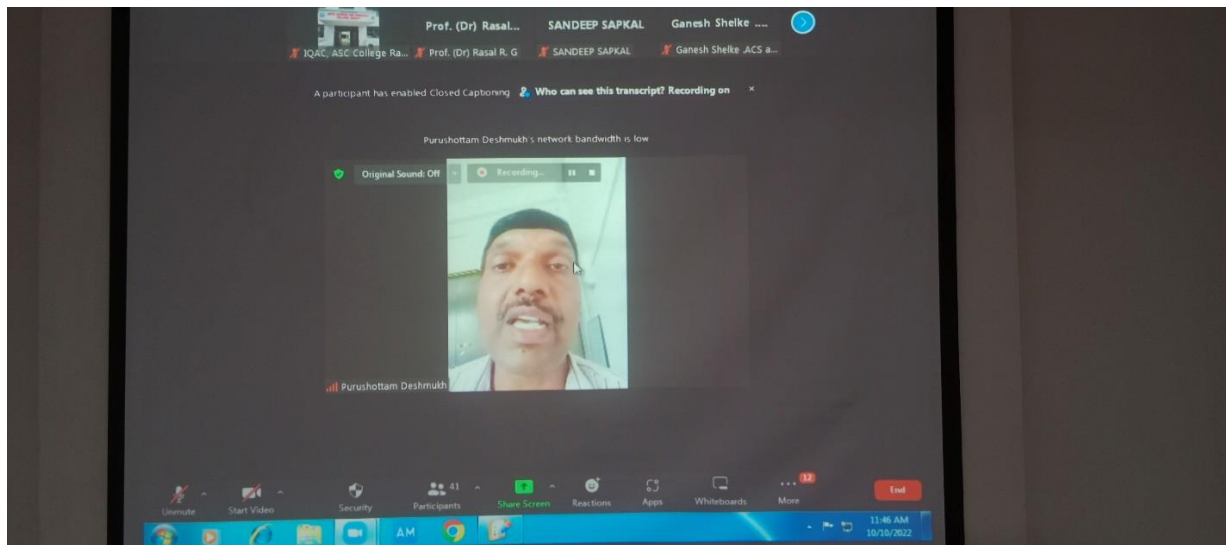

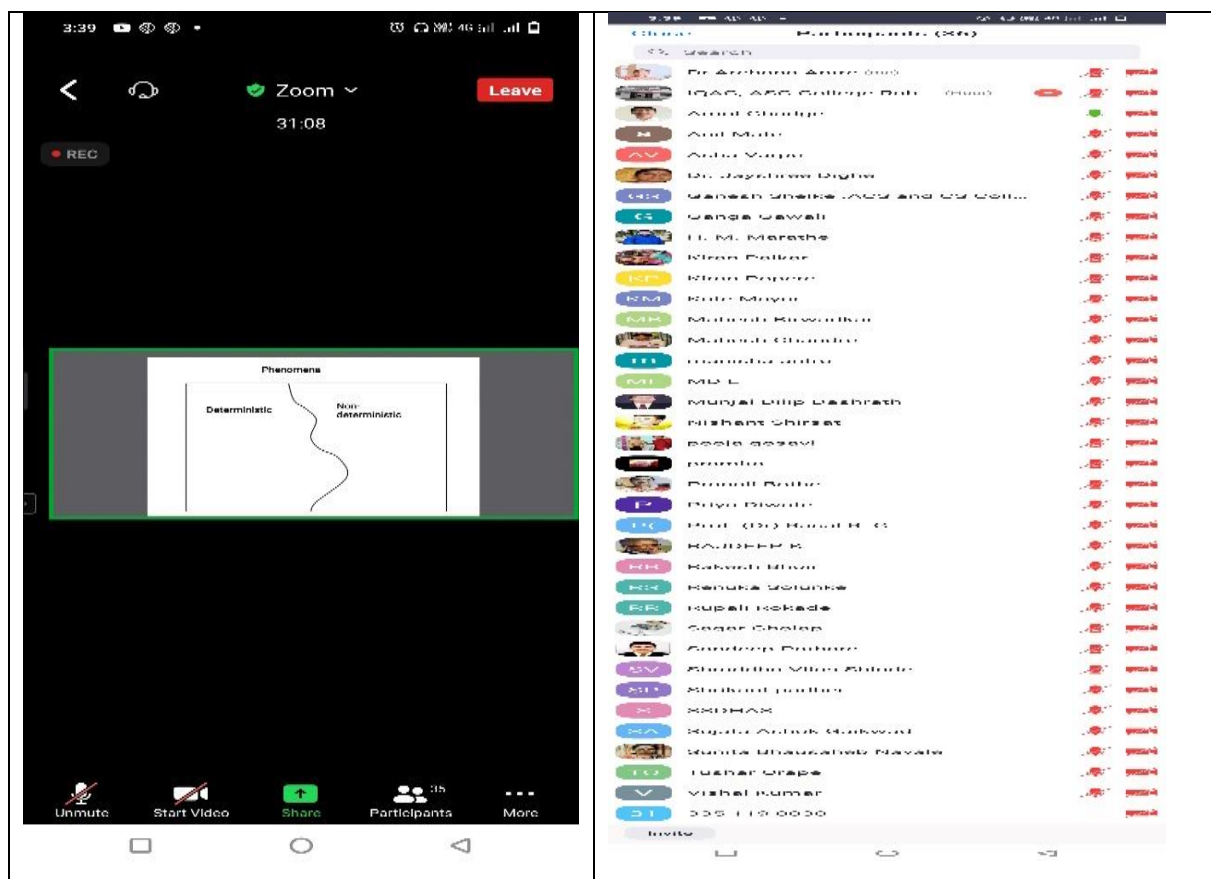


Snapshot of 1st Session on the topic Focus on Qualitative Research

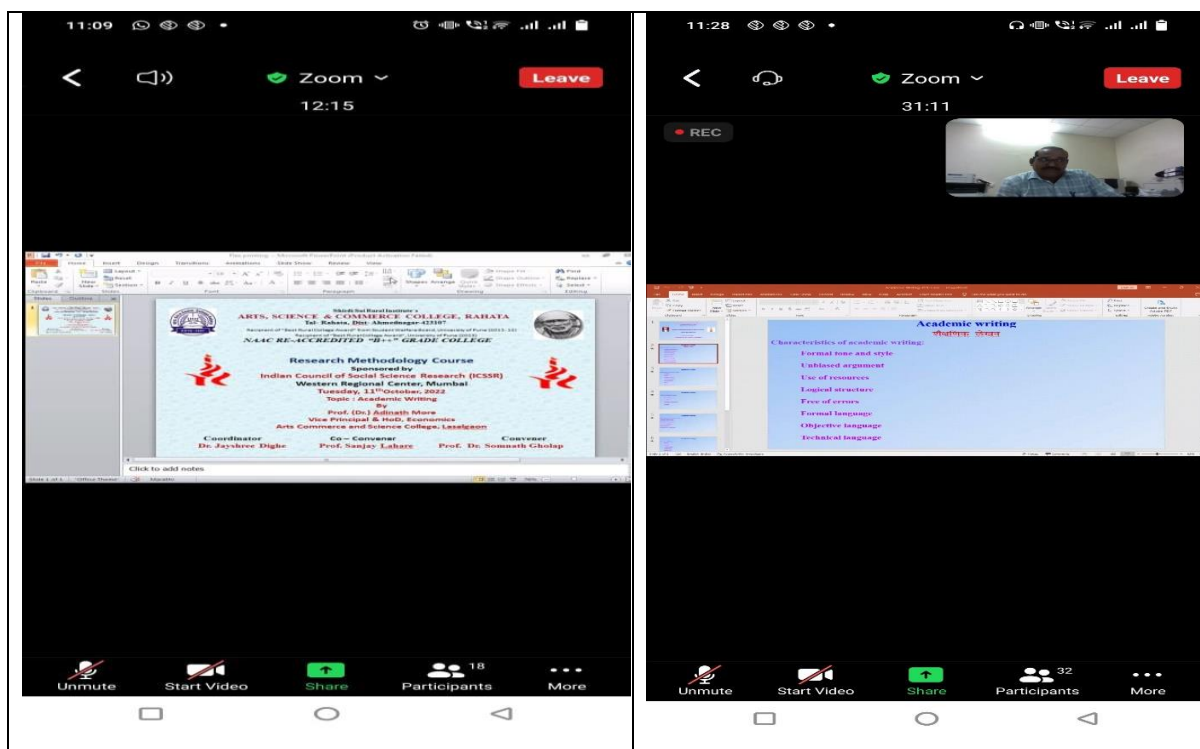

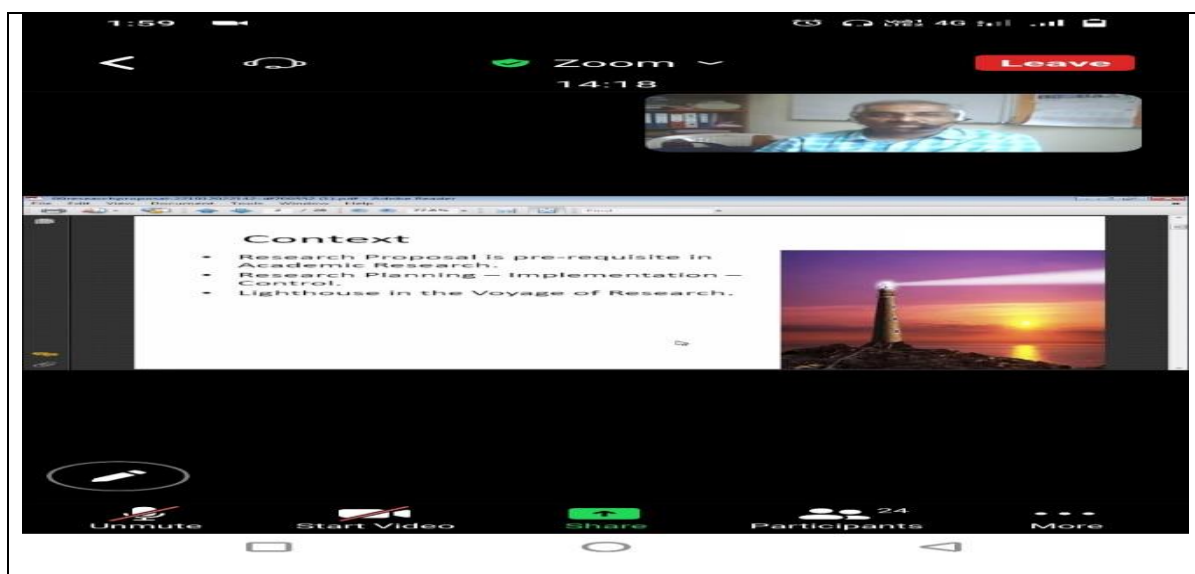
How to Write a Research Proposal

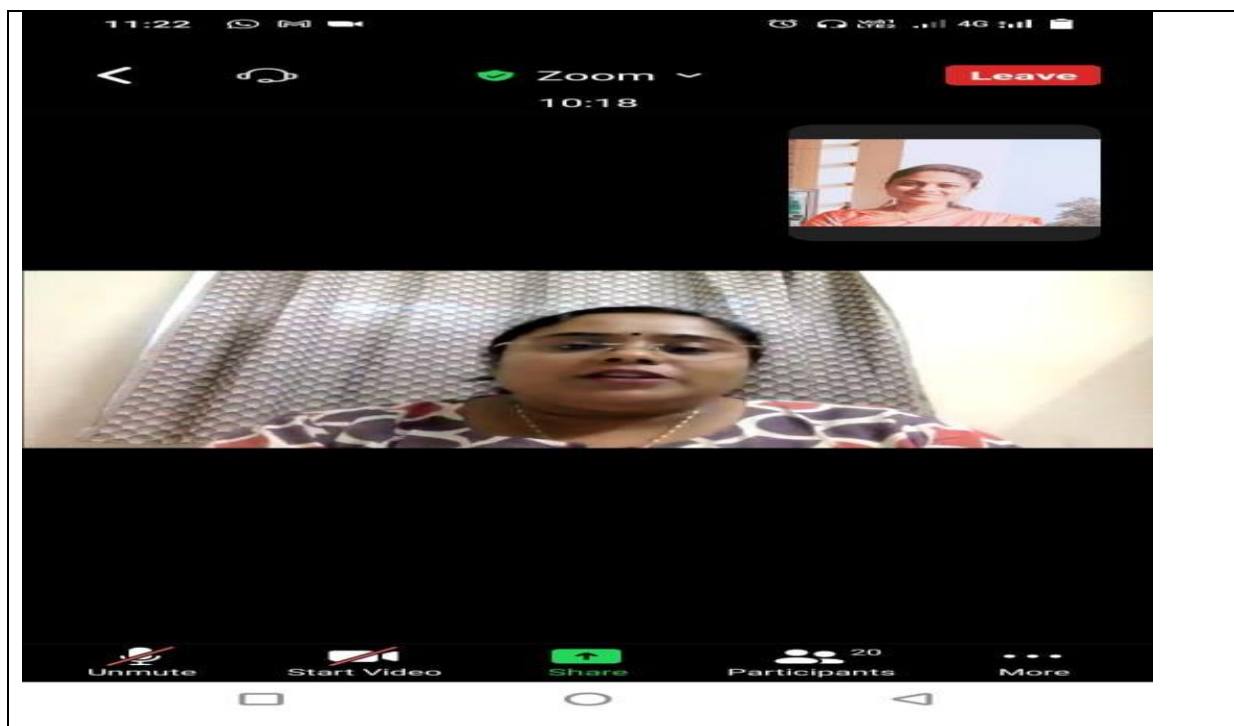

Research paper got rejected? Here's how to handle it- Take a minute to accept what happened, Read the rejection letter, Make sure you follow the author instructions, Match your paper to the journal, Resubmit to the same journal, or submit to a new journal, Volunteer at a journal.

What is the solution about rejection - Let's start with feelings: If you get rejected, acknowledge it to yourself. Don't try to brush off the hurt or pretend it's not painful. Instead of thinking "I shouldn't feel this way," think about how normal it is to feel like you do, given your situation. Notice how intense your feelings are.

Stages of rejection – Denial, Anger, Bargaining, Depression, Acceptance.

Common reasons for rejection- Incomplete data such as too small a sample size or missing or poor controls., Poor analysis such as using inappropriate statistical tests or a lack of statistics altogether.

Publication Process: Journal publication

An article is a piece of writing that has been published in either print or electronic form. - It could be for the goal of publicizing news, research findings, scholarly analysis, or discussion.,

Short communications, review papers, and other sorts of research pieces exist, and writing for academic publications is a highly competitive industry.

This procedure involves the following steps: i) locating a relevant journal, ii) preparing your manuscript for submission, iii) submission, iv) journal peer review, v) revision, vi) publication, and vii) sharing and promotion of the published piece. All of these processes in the publishing process necessitate dedication, patience, and hard work.

Major steps involved in publishing a research paper-

1. Perform Research Work
2. Prepare Manuscript
3. Submit Manuscript
4. Peer-review
5. Decision

Journal Impact Factor- The impact factor (IF) is frequently used as an indicator of the importance of a journal to its field.

The impact factor (IF) is a measure of the frequency with which the average article in a journal has been cited in a particular year.

It is used to measure the importance or rank of a journal by calculating the times its articles are cited.

It is a measure that reflects the average number of citations to articles published in journals, books, thesis, project reports, newspapers, conference/seminar proceedings, documents published in internet, notes, and any other approved documents.

According to Eugene Garfield “impact simply reflects the ability of the journals and editors to attract the best paper available.”

The IF applies only to journals, not to individual articles or individual scientists unlike the “H-index.”

The relative number of citations an individual article receives is better evaluated as “citation impact.”

Impact factor can be calculated after completing the minimum of 3 years of publication.

IF cannot be calculated for new journals.
